## Women's Imaging Center Touches Lives

"I came to the St. Luke's Wood River Women's Imaging Center as someone who had been diagnosed with something suspicious in my right breast," recalls Feli Funke-Riehle, a Pilates teacher. "Dr. Rodriguez, my OB/GYN, thought he had found an irregularity. I was really nervous." Fully funded by community generosity, the Center offers world-class digital mammography technology in a healing environment. "The whole experience was pretty amazing, and I am really, really grateful," Feli says. "Everything worked beautifully and smoothly." Registration was quick. The staff was caring, competent, and professional. Details such as personal lockers, cozy robes, and the high-end decor enhanced her experience.

During her visit, Feli experienced the benefits of centralized screenings. She moved quickly from a digital mammography exam to a follow-up ultrasound consultation, an exam that offers additional views of potential breast abnormalities. Throughout the experience, Feli was comforted by feelings of warmth and safety, professionalism and care. "We need to be incredibly grateful that we are able to live in a remote mountain town, have the active lifestyle we all love, and also enjoy the privilege of having a facility like this at our fingertips. We need to appreciate the proximity, diligence, professionalism, and quality of the health care we are receiving." Thankfully, Feli received a diagnosis of good health. She is now pursuing a master's degree in Pilates and hopes to expand her teaching so she can offer specific instruction to help breast cancer survivors.

## Advanced Mammography Technology

In August 2009, the St. Luke's Women's Imaging Center became a reality and has greatly enhanced health care for women in our community. The Center offers digital mammography, which is proven to be significantly better at detecting breast cancers for many women than the older analog technology. The impact of advanced mammography technology is evident in the increasing demand for breast imaging services; since the Center opened, breast care services have increased by 29 percent compared to last year.

## Healing Therapies Enhance Care

"I want to honor my mother by helping the hospital expand programs that encourage natural healing and healthy lifestyles," says Elisabeth, a mother of two and life-long resident of the Wood River Valley.

"It is truly exciting to see St. Luke's offer Integrative Therapies to its patients," says Dr. Tom Archie, board certified family physician, medial acupuncturist, and medical director of the Integrative Therapies program. "Integrating multi-disciplinary healing techniques into the hospital complements our efforts to enhance healing and promote wellness."

The Integrative Therapies program melds traditional western medicine with complementary healing techniques, and is made possible by the generosity of many donors. The program, which is in its first year, offers acupuncture, Healing Touch, yoga, weekly guided meditation, and access to a television station that features beautiful nature images and calming instrumental music. Future plans include massage therapy and other programs that encourage healthy lifestyles. Elisabeth hopes her involvement with the Foundation will help expand the Integrative Therapies program to enhance the health and well-being of patients.

## Healthy Hospital Food

Chris Kastner, renowned chef and the owner of CK's Real Foods, found himself cooking at an unexpected place—the hospital. This year St. Luke's transformed its food service program to a sustainable model featuring fresh and local products. The hospital's inpatient meals and Green Cuisine Café now offer food that is environmentally friendly, supports the local economy, and promotes good health. Green Cuisine has eliminated trans fats and minimized antibiotics, growth hormones, and high fructose corn syrup in the food supply.

As part of this project, local chefs who share a passion for fresh, local ingredients frequent the café to cook for the hospital community and share their culinary skills. The Foundation is committed to supporting the second phase of the Green Cuisine project, which includes further development of seasonal menus, continued training of kitchen staff to enhance their culinary skills, and the provision of community-wide cooking classes.

## Expert Emergency Services

Six-year-old Caroline Hold came to the St. Luke's Wood River Emergency Department suffering from a severe infection. After a day of treatment, Caroline decided she wanted to help the hospital. She teamed with her best friend and ice-skating partner, Marcella Fisher, to collect and donate children's DVDs to help kids undergoing treatment in the Emergency Department keep their mind off their pain or fear. "We were grateful for the expert emergency care Caroline received and were thrilled when she came up with a way to give back," said Caroline's mom, Karen Hold.

As Caroline's parents found out first-hand, there is tremendous comfort in knowing that quality emergency expertise for pediatric patients is available in the Wood River Valley. Board certified emergency physicians are on-site 24 hours a day, specially trained in the case of a pediatric emergency, heart attack, stroke, major trauma, or other emergencies. These expert physicians work closely with the Emergency Department nurses, who are skilled in trauma resuscitation, cardiac life support, and pediatric care.

To secure the future of emergency medicine at the hospital, St. Luke's Wood River Foundation continues its work to build an endowment fund that will sustain and improve our emergency services in perpetuity. The Foundation believes that its commitment to exceptional emergency care will bring peace of mind to families, in the same way that the generous efforts of compassionate kids like Caroline and Marcella bring a little peace and calm to children in the Emergency Department.

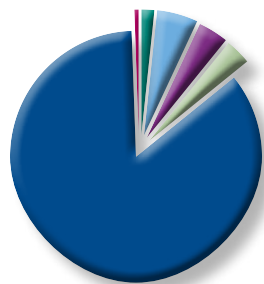

## Endowment Funds

The principal of each endowed fund is invested in accordance with the Foundation's Investment Policy and earnings are spent in consultation with each fund's donors, and at the discretion of the board of directors.*

### Endowed Funds of \$1,000,000 or More

**Emergency Services Endowment Fund:** Because Emergency Services are our community's highest health care priority, the hospital has built an emergency response network that coordinates care from a patient's initial 911 call through arrival at the hospital. This network includes board-certified emergency physicians and highly trained nurses who provide the best possible stabilization and treatment for patients suffering from heart attack, stroke, or serious injury. Your gift will help us build a \$10 million Emergency Services Endowment to fund superior emergency care now and for years to come.

## Women's Imaging Center

**Endowments:** As we near the completion of our Women's Imaging Center campaign, we are beginning work on our long-term goal to raise \$2 million to create three Women's Health Endowments to support mammogram scholarships for women in need, ensure state-of-the-art technology, and provide essential education and outreach.
